The Plan's governance structure is nearly complete with the newly formed Stakeholder Consultative Group(SCG) due to meet in Canberra in mid-November. The SCG membership includes broad representative coverage across peak industry councils, state farming organisations, state/territory agriculture/environmental jurisdictions, RD&E organisations as well as national animal welfare entities and a number of industry champions/stewards.

The SCG will provide a mechanism where relevant stakeholders have a voice in the implementation strategies developed to deliver the Plan with the opportunity to participate in that delivery process. The SCG allows the various primary and secondary stakeholders to be engaged in setting directions and priorities as the Plan rolls out.
